# How to Dress for a job interview – Women

# Perfect grooming is a MUST.

- How you dress says a great deal about you.
- What do you want to tell the people interviewing you.
- Sell youself!
- You have only 1 chance to make a good first impression
  - $\circ~$  It's better to dress up too much than to appear underdressed
- Trendy is fine as long as you keep your style subtle.
  - Clothes make a strong statement about you.

## Tips:

- 1. Call the receptionist/secretary or anyone you know who works at the place.

  - Really short skirts (no matter what the style is)
  - Tight sweaters
  - Sloppy overalls
  - Sandals
  - Low cut blouses
    - High cut blouses (no one want's to see your belly button)

- Wild colors and/or styles
- Torn jeans
- T-Shirts of any kind:
  - No Bob Marley
  - No skulls and dripping blood
  - No bimbo's
  - No alcohol commercial
- No sports team clothes
- 5. Check your outfit for:
  - Holes, tears, rips
  - Stains, dirt, sweat marks
  - Scuffs, wrinkles
- 6. Tone down the use of:
  - Makeup (you're not going to the carnival)
  - Hair spray
  - Perfume (don't drive people away by the way you smell)
  - Jewelry.
  - One nose ring is one too many and may cost you the job of your dreams
    - $\circ~$  Put the nose ring back in when you get home
